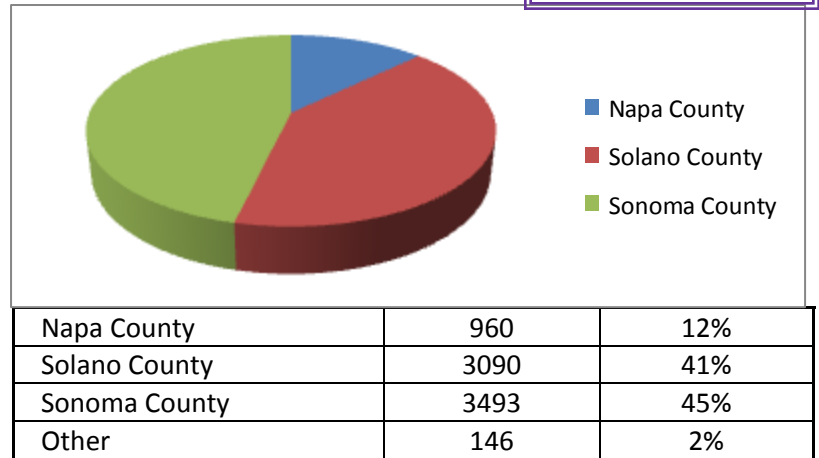

WHAT WE DO

North Bay Regional Center (NBRC) is a private, non-profit corporation contracting with the State of California to provide diagnostic, evaluation, service coordination, and early intervention services to individuals with developmental disabilities. Each individual served is assigned a service coordinator who assesses, identifies, purchases, coordinates and monitors services to ensure the necessary supports are received. These supports allow individuals to live in the least restrictive manner in accordance with personal choice.

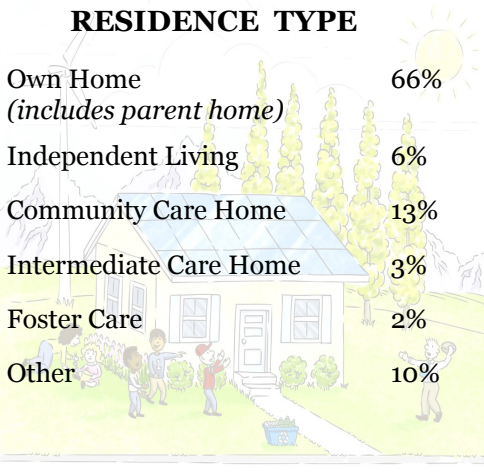

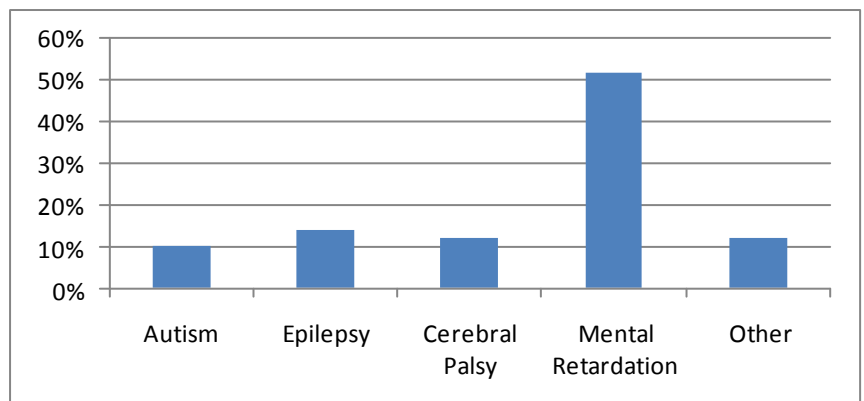

DISABILITY TYPE



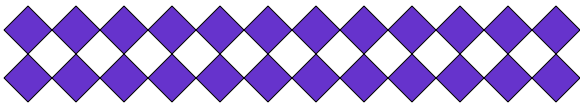
EARLY START PROGRAM

In California the Early Start Program serves infants and toddlers 0-3 years of age. To be eligible, infants or toddlers must have a significant delay in one or more areas of development or at risk of having a developmental disability. At NBRC referrals for Early Start can be made through the "Warmline" at (800) 646-3268. In 2010, NBRC provided early interventions services to 749 infants and toddlers. Of this total, the services received resulted in xxx, or x% 'graduating' out of the Regional Center services system as no developmental disability was diagnosed.



NBRC BOARD OF DIRECTORS

NBRC is governed by 12 Board Members, 4 from each county of NBRC's catchment area, plus one representative from the Vendor Advisory Committee (VAC). This Board reflects the diversity of our community and Board Members must be an NBRC recipient of services, have a child or family member receiving NBRC services, or have vested interest in serving our community. The Board meets once per month and oversees operations and management of NBRC, responding to community needs and interests to promote opportunities and support choices for people with developmental disabilities.



NBRC STAFF

NBRC is staffed by 192 individuals which includes Client Program Coordinators (CPC), Early Intervention Specialists (EIS), Quality Assurance Monitors, Community Resource Consultants, Consumer Advocate, psychologists, physicians, nurses, and a senior management team and executive staff, as well as fiscal staff. CPCs and EIS' assess for service needs, refer to community agencies, purchase services needed, and monitor services for quality outcomes for an average of 75 individuals per caseload. The NBRC Community Services Unit oversees and monitors vendors, including program development and vendorization, for over 3000 service providers/vendors.
